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JUDGMENT

Pursuant to the Order Granting Final Approval of Class Action Settlement entered on July 30, 2024, it is hereby **ORDERED**, **ADJUDGED AND DECREED** as follows:

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1. Judgment in this matter is entered in accordance with the Court's Order Granting Final Approval of Class Action Settlement and the parties' Amended Class and PAGA Action Settlement Agreement and Release ("Settlement Agreement"). Unless otherwise provided herein, all capitalized terms used herein shall have the same meaning as defined in the Settlement Agreement.

2. As provided by the Order Granting Final Approval of Class Action Settlement, all 9 Participating Class Members are permanently barred and enjoined from prosecuting, pursuing, or 10 11 seeking to reopen, any of the Released Class Claims against Defendant and the Released Parties, as 12 defined in the Settlement Agreement.¹ Consistent with the definitions provided in the Settlement 13 Agreement, the Settlement Class consists of: All current and former non-exempt hourly employees of 14 Defendant working in Ralphs division stores in the State of California at any time during the period of 15 from July 23, 2015 to March 9, 2022. 16

As provided by the Order Granting Final Approval of Class Action Settlement, all 3. 17 18 PAGA Members are permanently barred and enjoined from prosecuting pursuing, or seeking to 19 reopen, any of the Released PAGA Claims against Defendant and the Released Parties, as defined in 20 the Settlement Agreement. Consistent with the definitions provided in the Settlement Agreement, the 21 aggrieved employees or PAGA Members consist of: Ralphs PAGA Members: All current and former 22 non-exempt hourly employees of Defendant in working in Ralphs division stores in the State of 23 California at any time during the period from November 9, 2013 to March 9, 2022; and Food 4 Less 24
